

Wildlife Pond Habitat Improvement

Stoney Creek

An existing pond had filled in over time. The area was re-excavated and native shrubs were planted around the edge of the pond to establish riparian vegetation. This project helps improve connectivity between existing habitat features.

The pond located on this property has filled in over the years. To restore the wildlife habitat lost, the pond was re-dug.



The area surrounding the pond was planted with native shrubs. These plants will not only help stabilize the shoreline, but will also contribute to wildlife habitat in the area.



A duck's nest containing eggs was spotted when the native shrubs were being planted. This is a great example of how establishing woody vegetation can help provide habitat for ducks as well as other bird and mammal species.
