**Reporting a Violation is VERY Important**

If you see or suspect someone of abusing a natural resource, please call **1-877-TIPS-MNR (847-7667) toll-free any time to report a violation or call Crime Stoppers anonymously at 1-800-222-TIPS (8477).**

Be sure to include information on the exact location of the violation, date and time of the violation, and a description of the individuals and vehicles involved. Timely and accurate information will assist conservation officers in apprehending violators and **protect your natural resources**. The OFAH encourages you to report anything suspicious to the MNR Tips line. The information you have may just be the important piece needed to stop the abuse. Our MNR Conservation Officers cannot be everywhere all of the time. Please help them protect our natural resources.

**Asian Carp - Serious Threat to our Great Lakes**



Asian Carp when they begin to populate our Great Lakes will seriously impact our lakes and rivers in Zone J.

These carp were initially imported from Asia to control algae in catfish ponds in the southern states. Severe flooding of the Mississippi a decade ago allowed these imports to invade the largest American watersheds spreading all the way up to the Chicago sanitary and barge canal. Electric barriers were erected to prevent the carp from advancing into this canal, which is also connected, to Lake Michigan. Concerns persist from DNA sampling that some Asian carp may have already entered the Great Lakes. Our OFAH Invading Species specialist Francine Mac Donald was involved

in the latest attempt to prevent these carp from accessing Lake Michigan

Simply put the two most worrisome varieties "Big Head," which grow to 100 lbs and look like their eyes are too low in the head and the "Silver" that are startled by motors and jump out of the water. These carp have already overwhelmed parts the Mississippi and Ohio Basins. They out produce local species of fish and while growing feed on the same micro-organisms that local fish rely on. This seriously changes the food chain in their favour and reduces the biodiversity in watersheds that they invade.

While we've already experienced changes from invading and introduced species where impacts on our most desirable game fish has been felt by anglers these larger invaders are especially worrisome so it's important for all of us to not exacerbate this problem by importing bait from the States or generally not releasing live bait in any locations.

Reporting any sale of live carp species to MNR or adding your name to the Michigan petition that's trying to stop further passage through that Chicago Illinois canal system.

**A true example of sportsman helping sportsman**

On Feb 26, 2010 the Outdoors community banded together to help one of their own. On Dec 28,2010, Kevin Brown, a Sebringville man and hunting enthusiast, was severely injured when a skate blade sliced his neck while officiating an OHL hockey game in Woodstock, Ont. The story made national headlines and was featured on Hockey night in Canada's "Coaches Corner" during Stratford's Hockey day in Canada Celebrations and broadcast.

Kevin has a long road ahead of him and was unable to attend the function as is still recovering from injuries at hospital in London, Ont. Members of the Flensburg Hunt Club (whom Kevin hunts with) decided to organize a fund raiser to help Kevin

(nickname "downtown") with help from the long standing OFAH affiliated host club, The Gadshill Sportsman Club. The all day BBQ and trap shoot saw people from all over the area coming to shoot and making donations, many whom have never met Kevin. Local businesses saw to it that the prize table was full along with their generous cash donations. When the day was finished, 26 rounds of trap had been shot (3250 shells). This all day event was the largest shoot the Gadshill club has ever hosted noted Gord Player from Gadshill Sportsman, "It was great to see so much support". **\$4502.00** was raised to help Kevin and his family with some of the costs during his recovery.
